**Legislative Public Records Bill**

There was a bill this week that came out of a standing committee in Cheyenne that is scheduled to be introduced in the legislative session regarding some dramatic changes to the Public Records Act. The most concerning is the changes to penalties for violation, which are now drafted as being a felony, with prison time for willful non-compliance. I seriously doubt it will make it through the legislature with felony provisions, but it will still be something to watch closely.

**WGIF laddering?**

We have another batch of CD's coming due in February. \$3M. Should we put together a strategy for laddering some of the available funds? For Mt. Nebo, others? Could buy in smaller increments \$1M and get slightly higher rates because of a smaller average pool (4 CD's instead of 11 or 12).

**State Statute regarding texting, or other forms of communication (Trello)**

(d) No meeting shall be conducted by electronic means or any other form of communication that does not permit the public to hear, read or otherwise discern meeting discussion contemporaneously. Communications outside a meeting, including, but not limited to, sequential communications among members of an agency, shall not be used to circumvent the purpose of this act.
